	 All certified staff will complete Trauma Informed Learning professional development series Students and staff will work together to promote the cultures and identities of extra-curriculars at GHS this year. Each week of the year will be hosted by a different club/organization where they will promote their club, invite the school community to their events, and increase the visibility of the club. Students and staff will use feedback from our club/organization meetings to better evaluate the school climate and increase student voice. Teachers will communicate with families regularly, specifically when reports are written for student behavior. Support from parents/guardians will be a part of the discipline strategy for level 1 and 2 infractions.
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
